

ALL AROUND SCOUTING SESSIONS	
Knots and Ropes	How not to be “a-frayed” of knots! This session will show you basic knots that can be “taut” to the youth.
Walking Sticks	Make hiking more fun! Whether constructed from a broomstick or a tree branch, learn how to create a durable and useful walking stick. Take one home with you!
Neckerchief Slides	Everyone wears neckerchiefs! In this interactive session the leaders will construct several fun slides to take home.
Games and More	Games are more than fun! Learn the reasons we play games with our youth. You will learn fun new games that will develop self-confidence, teamwork and are age appropriate.
Working with Tools 1 (For Beginners)	Introduction to basic tools and their uses. Learn how to handle a knife safely and teach youth to earn their Whittlin’ Chip.
Working with Tools 2 (New Session)	Familiar with basic tools and knife safety? This session puts that knowledge to work using tools to build simple and advanced projects.
Thingamajigs and Whatchamacallits	Reach into your tool box and discover ideas and hands on projects. This session will cover a variety of gadgets, doodles and other fun items to make outside and inside.
Hiking Survival 101	Make hiking a fun part of your program! Learn about hiking safety, guidelines, pre-hiking activities, equipment, awards and great locations to hike.
Cubs in the Kitchen	Learn how to build a nutritious program through easy to cook and non-cooking recipes. Make and take some simple fun recipes with you.
Skits and Run-Ons	Make your den the center of attention through simple, easy, fun skits and run-ons the boys can do at pack meetings, campfires and den meetings.
Managing Boy Behavior	Boys and their personalities are as different as nuts and bolts; your approach for each one has to be different as well. This class will help you develop skills and strategies for dealing with various kinds of behavior, communicating with families/parents, how to adapt your program to engage behaviorally challenged boys. Turn a difficult situation into a positive experience.
Camping for all Ages	Leaders from Tigers to Webelos will learn age appropriate camping ideas, where to go, types of camping available and what to take along with you to make it fun.
Outing in Scouting	Spend time learning about outdoor activities you can do with your Scouts. Learn about geocaching with the boys, building bug houses and many other outdoor activities. (This session will take place outdoors)

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Derbies and Races	Whether it's a block of pinewood or a boat hull with a sail or a rocket ship racing on a string...All Cubs LOVE DERBIES!! Tips and hands on ideas for all the different races and how to incorporate them in your yearly program. READY! SET! GO!
Celebrate Scouting!! Blue and Gold Banquets	Quite possibly, the biggest event of the cub scouting year, the Blue and Gold is an extravaganza for everyone involved. This class will share ideas for decorations, food service, program, awards, locations and more!
Pack Meeting Pizzazz	Does your pack meeting need a little spark? Trouble engaging the youth? Get ideas and tips to Jazz UP your pack meetings, how to make it fun for boys and adults. Lots of hands on ideas and classroom participation to make your pack meeting a success.
Grossology— Icky, Ooey, Sticky, Gooley	Sometimes it's ooey, gooey, sticky, icky, slimy, mushy, oozy. Fun hands-on activities for the boys to do indoors and outdoors.
Challenging Parents (NEW COURSE)	How do we channel the energy and enthusiasm of the adults in your unit to improve your overall program. In this session you will share hints, ideas and methods to motivate unit adults in a positive manner.
Leader Forum (NEW 2 HR SESSION)	This session is a 4 round robin topic discussion to share you ideas and concerns. Today's topics are Troop/Pack relations, Recruiting Help, Challenging boys, Meeting One.

Re-Chartering Online	Learn about the Online Re-chartering process and how the Journey to Excellence program works.
Managing the Pack	Leaders need to know how to run their pack, learn what their responsibilities are and how to develop a plan. "Failure to plan is Planning to Fail."
The 4 "R's"	Recruiting, Retaining, Rewarding and Recognizing adult volunteers! Ideas to show them appreciation and recognition.
Ceremonies that Sizzle	Learn who, what, where, when and how of ceremonies. Leaders learn basics of how to make ceremonies fun and educational.
Money Matters the Pack Budget (NEW 2HR SESSION)	This course gives an overview of money matters from how to build an annual budget, how to invest the parents in the financial health of the pack and how to raise the money needed from fundraisers to donations.

PACK LEADERS	
Pack Camping Chairman	This course will teach everything needed to promote and organize a successful camping program within the pack. This course teaches the administration basics and is not a hands on course.
Special Needs Scouting For All Scouts	Do you have youth in your unit with Special Need? Learn how to incorporate Special Needs youth and encourage their success in the Scouting program.
RANK SPECIFIC	
“Certified” SuperNova Mentor (New)	Dive into BSA’s STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) exploration ! Learn how to become a Supernova mentor and help your pack earn their Supernova Awards. You will learn all about the program and take the first steps to becoming a certified Supernova mentor.
Training Tigers	It’s difficult to keep young boys attention. In our class we’ll learn how to get them engaged in learning, how to keep Go See Its fun, ways to keep meeting interesting and how to keep Tigers involved in pack activities.

Wondering Wolves	New Wolf leaders or experienced leaders will gain new insights from this hands-on session. The blueprints will show how den meetings should include activities, crafts, songs and games. You will also receive suggestions on field trips, openings and closings.
Webelos in the Work Zone	This is a (2 hour session and outdoors) Build your Webelos a strong foundation of cooking in preparation for Boy Scouts. Starting with meal planning and duty rosters, the crew will lead the way thru simple open fire cooking ideas and examples, ease thru meal preparation and sample treats along the way.
Crossing the Bridge – Webelos to Scout Transition	How do we prepare our Webelos to transition into the Troop program with ease? Learn how to prepare Scouts/Families for the transition and change. We’ll learn about the disappearing packet, how to help Webelos choose a Troop, build excitement and share ideas to retain your Scouts.
