## Joining the BSA and Becoming a Merit Badge Counselor

The actions to take to become a Merit Badge Counselor if you are not a member of the BSA:

## After your application is received at the Council Office:

Approval process begins with the District	The appropriate District Advancement Chair will be
Advancement Chair	notified of the application for review and approval. This
	can take a day, or it can take several weeks. The
	turnaround time varies District by District.
Background check is submitted	Once the District has approved the application the
	background check will be submitted. The results of the
	check can take approximately five business days. The
	applicate may receive emails regarding the progress.
Council systems updated	Once the clear background check is received the council
	system will be updated with the position. The Applicant
	may receive a notice from Scoutbook of this action. The
	following business day the badges will be added to the
	person's profile and to Scoutbook. The Merit Badge
	Counselor Directory will be updated.
Notification will be emailed	The council office will email the applicant to inform them
	of the approval and other various information regarding
	renewals, etc.
Counseling may begin	Only after the approval process is completed should a
	counselor have contact with the youth.

## **Important Information:**

Merit Badge Counselors do not qualify for overnight activities/events. If you wish to participate in your unit's activities, you will need to join the unit. If joining the unit is the better option for you, please do that first. Your Merit Badge Counselor position can be added as a multiple position at no cost after that primary unit membership is processed.

<u>Merit Badge Counselor positions must be renewed annually.</u> National will email you approximately 2 months before the expiration date of your position to invite you to renew.

Badge selection is a Council function. Merit Badge Counselor membership is a two-step process. One step is the position, which is a district position, not a unit position. The second step is the badge(s) you have selected to work with. The position requires youth protection and background checks that are reviewed at a National level. The badge requires subject matter knowledge that is reviewed at a local level. Badges do not need to be renewed. To make any changes to badges contact your Council office.

Generally, there are <u>four badges</u> approved per counselor in the most populated districts. Your District Advancement Chair will work with you regarding limits.

Scoutbook vs Merit Badge Counselor Directory. Your counselor information will be listed in two places. Scoutbook has a direct link to the registration systems used by the Council and National. It is important to keep your email contact up to date in Scoutbook/my.scouting.org as this is how National will contact you for updates and renewals. The Directory is maintained for use by units and scouts/families that do use Scoutbook or do not have access to Scoutbook or like the ease of the Directory. Once you are approved as a counselor you will be given the access codes to open the Directory. It is password protected and does not align with your other BSA passwords.
