



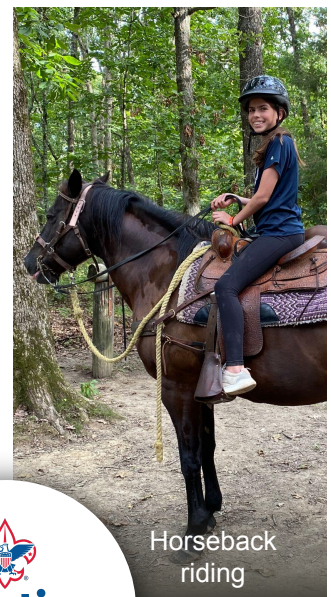
The adventures begin with Scouting America's Troop 21G in Clayton!
