



Christmas Slime

Ingredients

- 1 bottle of Elmer's glue 6 oz
- · Brown food coloring for the Rudolph slime jar
- 1/2 TSP of Baking Soda
- 1½ TBSP of Contact lens solution. *Important: your brand of Contact Lens Solution must contain boric acid and sodium borate.
- Optional: add 1 TBSP of water to your glue before adding baking soda if you'd like a stretchier slime

How to Make Slime With Contact Solution



5 from 21 votes

Ingredients

- 1 Bottle of Elmer's Glue (6 oz or 3/4 cup of glue)
- 1/2 teaspoon Baking Soda
- 1½ TBSP of Contact Lens Solution
- 1 TBSP Optional Add 1/4 cup of water if you'd like a more stretchy slime. We do recommend doing this step.
- · Optional Add in extra glitter if desired

Instructions

- 1. Get a bowl to mix your slime ingredients in.
- 2. Pour your entire 6 oz Elmer's Glitter glue into the bowl.
- Add your baking soda and mix in thoroughly. Also add up to 1/4 cup of water here if you want a more stretchy slime.
- 4. Slowly add in your contact lens solution (reminder: your contact lens solution should contain boric acid or your slime will not form). Add it in slowly and mix if possible so that you can adjust and ensure you do not add too much. You may not need the full amount so take this step slowly.
- 5. Now mix until your slime forms and begins to harden. Take it out and knead, knead, knead. You may be surprised how much you need to knead to really make the slime form. If it's not the desirable consistency keep kneading. If you find it to still be too sticky, add a little bit of lotion or baby oil to your hands.

Directions to Make Your Christmas Slime Jar Faces

- For the Rudolph Jar: Glue on your googly eyes and the red pom pom. To make the antlers, tie one pipe cleaner around the jar lip. Cut two smaller pieces of pipe cleaner and then tie these around your two ends.
- For this slime, you'll need to use brown food coloring to dye your glue brown.



• For the Snowman Jar: glue on your googly eyes, orange felt for the nose and small black buttons for the mouth!



• For the Grinch Jar: Glue on your googly eyes and then make the face using a black sharpie. Cut a strip of red felt to fit the size of the jar lid and hot glue this to your lid (adults only).



Graham Cracker Gingerbread Houses

Learn our easy method for making graham cracker gingerbread houses that won't collapse.






Ingredients


- 4 full Graham Crackers Walmart Great Value brand works well!
- White Chocolate Chips
- Christmas Candies

Instructions

1. Place one full graham cracker on a cutting board. Use a serrated knife to carefully cut diagonally across the top half as shown (a gently sawing motion works best). Cut diagonally the other way so the graham cracker has a triangle shape on top. Repeat with a second graham cracker.




2. Cut the other two graham crackers in half so you have four graham cracker halves and two graham cracker halves with triangle shapes on top (they will support the roof).



3. Lay one roof support cracker in between two graham cracker halves. Pipe a line of melted white chocolate (or royal icing) down each side of the graham cracker halves.



4. Fold up each graham cracker half and press it again the edges of the roof support cracker. Hold for about a minute, then carefully lift up all three crackers to a standing position and insert the other roof support cracker.



5. You now have the four walls put together. Pipe white chocolate or frosting along the top edges of all four crackers and place the two remaining cracker halves on as a roof, piping additional white chocolate along the peak of the roof.



6. Let house stand for at least 10 minutes to set up, and then decorate with candy as desired.



Notes

You can speed the setting up process by putting the house in the fridge.

How to Make Paper Snowflakes

Making paper snowflakes is a fun Christmas craft for kids and adults!

Prep Time 15 mins





Ingredients

- Paper lightweight paper such as tracing paper is recommended
- Scissors
- Templates optional

Instructions

1. Fold a sheet of paper into quarters, creasing well.



2. Bring the two folded edges together to create a triangle and crease well.




3. Flip the paper over and fold again, from the same corner, to create a narrower triangle.




4. Cut across the top of the paper as shown. Cut across the point of the triangle if desired to make a hole in the center of the snowflake.



5. Make cuts from either side of the triangle to create designs. Cut across the top of the triangle at an angle or in a curve to create the edge of your snowflake. When you're done cutting, unfold the paper to reveal the finished snowflake.



6. To use a template, print and cut out the template. Fold the paper as directed above, then trace the template on it.



7. Cut along the marked lines, then unfold to reveal the snowflake design.



Notes

Tracing paper is highly recommended if you are doing this craft with children, as it's much easier to cut through than copy paper.

Paper snowflakes can be ironed on medium heat to remove the creases.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The District Award of Merit is a council award presented by districts in the same manner that the Silver Beaver is a national award presented by councils.

The award is available to Scouters who render service of an outstanding nature at the district level.

The award is made available annually on the basis of 1 for each 25 traditional units or fraction thereof. The district need not present all the awards to which it is entitled each year.

It is not appropriate to nominate a Scouter who has already received this award.

A professional Scouter or other council employee may not receive this award based on employment service. However, a professional Scouter or employee who also serves as a volunteer Scouter may be eligible, based on *volunteer* service.

REQUIREMENTS

- 1. A nominee must be a registered Scouter.
- 2. A nominee must have rendered noteworthy service to youth in Scouting, outside Scouting, or both.

Note: The nature and value of "noteworthy service to youth" may consist of a single plan or decisions that contributed vitally to the lives of large numbers of youth or it may have been given to a small group over an extended period of time.

- 3. Consideration must be given to the nominee's Scouting position and the corresponding opportunity to render outstanding service beyond the expectations of that Scouting position.
- 4. The nominee's attitude toward and cooperation with the district and/or council is to be taken into consideration.
- 5. Nominations cannot be considered for posthumous awards.

PROCEDURE

- 1. Annually, district chairmen will appoint a temporary special District Award of Merit committee of not more than five persons who will consider all candidates and make recommendations of those to receive the award to the council through the Scout executive.
- 2. The Scout executive will inform the district chairman of those nominations approved by the council committee.
- 3. The following procedure is suggested for such presentation ceremonies:
 - a. The recipient and spouse should be in attendance at the annual meeting or recognition dinner.
 - b. A district and/or council officer should explain the award and its significance.
 - Eagle Scouts or Silver Award Venturers should be asked to escort the recipients to a place of honor at the head table or on stage.
 - d. A suitable citation for each recipient should be read indicating what each has done in Scouting.
 - e. The award (certificate, No. 33719; plaque, No. 17565; and lapel pin, No. 17551) may be presented at this time with appropriate congratulations.
 - f. The only uniform insignia which accompanies this award is an embroidered overhand knot, No. 05013.
 - g. A group picture may be taken for use in neighborhood or community newspapers (district responsibility).
