Camp Rules and Guidelines

Camp Code

 The Scout Oath and Scout Law is the camp code at all times. Violating the Scout Oath or Scout Law may result in an individual, or their entire Den, being asked to leave the event.

Parking

Parking is allowed only in parking areas designated by the staff. There will be a designated
parking area for the Call of the Wild event. It is District policy to leave room for a walkway in
the grass. This is to allow Scouts to move from campsite to campsite safely. Please keep this
grass easement open after your camp is completely set up.

Lions' and Tigers' Adult

- Lions and Tigers are required to have a parent or other caring adult with them at activities
- We ask these adults to participate in the session activities.

Tigers and Wolves

- Tigers and Wolves will each go on a hike as part of a belt loop.
- Tigers go on a short hike.
- Wolves go on a 1 mile hike.
- Make sure everyone has appropriate footwear. Paths are not paved. You will be hiking in the woods.
- If a scout has any restraints, let us know at check in.

All Ranks

- Any adults accompanying the Cub Scouts, please assist the scouts to focus on the session.
 We have a lot of exciting activities, and sometimes it can be too much.
- If your group has a lot of adults, please volunteer to help out at a session for the day. Any and all volunteers are appreciated. Please contact Amy, or stop by the Registration pavilion.
- Everyone who is eating through the Quartermaster's will be given a bracelet. Those who have lost their bracelet must stop by the Registration Pavilion to verify and receive a new bracelet.
- Lunch will be held on the Sports Field. There are no chairs or benches to sit on. Feel free to bring your own.









Cub World

- Call of the Wild Campout has access to most of Cub World. Areas that are off limits include Mud Cave, the Maze, Pavilion #1 (area behind Cub World Building), Fort Hussman, Eagle Nest.
- We do have access to the Mine and Pirate Ship.

Camp Sites

- Camp site assignments will be given out the day of the event.
- Campsite assignments are organized by pack. Small packs and individual campers will be grouped together.
- Campsites are assigned by the number of tents in your group.
- Questions about your campsite? Please speak with the Camp Overseer or Tom Oliver.

Campfire

- Campfire starts at 7pm Saturday
- It takes place at the Council Ring (near the swings)
- Tigers need to attend a campfire for advancement
- Wolves need to perform a skit at a campfire for advancement
 - Wolves will have time to create a skit during the session Howling at the Moon
- Bears need to campout one night for advancement
- Lions, Tigers, Wolves, and Bears will learn a song throughout the day to perform at Campfire. Song sheets will be passed out the Sessions

LOE/BALOO

- Each pack is not required to have a LOE/BALOO trained leader
- We will have at least one or more trained leaders for camping

First Aid

- In the event something occurs, First Aid is at the Registration Pavilion. A Medical Professional will be there on stand-by.
- We also have a Wilderness First Aid trained leader on-site.

Garbage

All trash must be put into trash bags and disposed of properly away from the Campsite.
 Pack must take out all their trash! You may only use the dumpsters at the Ranger Maintenance
 Area if they are not already full and/or overflowing.



Fires

Ground fires are allowed, but should be placed in existing fire pits.

Pressurized Fuel

 Pressurized fuel lanterns and stoves are allowed, but may only be used by an Adult with the proper training (Toasted Chit). All fuel must be properly stored and kept away from tents.

Alcohol

Alcohol and drugs are simply NOT allowed. Period.

Sheath Knives

• Sheath knives are **NOT** permitted on Council property or at any Council activities.

Transportation

 When transporting Scouts in vehicles, they must be in proper passenger seats wearing seat belts at all times. Riding in the back of trucks or on tailgates is prohibited.

Health Forms

Health Forms A & B need to be turned into Headquarters before or at the beginning of the
event. Health Forms are required for all individuals attending the event. (Amy will be at the
check-in table the morning of the event.) The Health Forms will be returned at the end of the
event.

COVID Policy

 Current CDC and BSA policy will be followed. Information will be disseminated as we get closer to the event.

As Baden-Powell remarked, "My ideal camp is where everyone is cheery and busy, where the patrols are kept intact under all circumstances, and where every patrol leader and Scout takes a genuine pride in his camp and his gadgets."
