This fosters a formal, timely plan for regular dialogue between the chartered organization and BSA, and assures membership is current so Scouts can participate in Scouting activities and advance in rank. Commissioners support the timely, error-free completion of the renewal.

Once effective relationships have started to develop, unit commissioners will likely find greater acceptance of a collaborative approach to unit assessment and plan development.
