You do not have to be in the Greater St. Louis Area Council to join us for this event.

Welcome to the Program Guide for the Eclipse Fest @ S-F Scout Ranch. There is also an event happening at Pine Ridge Scout Camp and Camp Lewallen the weekend of April 5th-8th, 2024.

We welcome anyone to this <u>Council Scouting Event</u>. We wanted to take a moment and clarify a few items before you look at the exciting adventure awaiting you at this event.

In Council vs Out of Council: Any registered Scout, unit, and Scouting family is welcome to join us at this event. There is no cost difference for out of council groups.

Participants:

- Youth:
 - Cub Scout aged youth (elementary school) are welcome to bring siblings (of Cub Scouting age) without those siblings being registered in the BSA.
 - Scouts BSA, Venturing, Sea Scouting, and Exploring aged youth (middle school, high school, and college) must be either registered in the BSA or a prospective member of the BSA (thinking about joining).
 - For simplicity sake, we are considering anyone a youth for programming until they turn 21. YPT rules all still apply.
- Adults: Following national's rules...
 - Registered Leaders: You are welcome on the property at any time day/night.
 - Cub Parents: You are welcome on the property at any time day/night as long as your own kid is at the event.
 - Parents of Other Programs: You are welcome on the property during the day time. If you are NOT a registered BSA Leader, you will need to leave property after evening program. There are multiple state parks and hotels in the area.

Camping Spaces:

- Our event is designated as a Council level event, allowing Cub Scouts to camp three nights as they
 would at a Council Family Camp.
- With the size of our camp property, and after council's review, we will be designating campsites to group the Cub units into one area of the camporee field and campsites inside Famous Eagle.
- We know there are some packs that are not set-up with the camping and cooking gear they need to support this long of a weekend program. Those units are welcome to be hosted by their Scouts BSA Troop, Venturing Crew, or Sea Scout Ship.
 - Those groups will be designated areas between where "just packs" and "just older units" are camping.
 - We ask that within your own "campsite space" all non-registered Cub Scout Parents are camping
 to one side of that space and the older youth are at the other side of that space.

Program Spaces:

- All events will have a sign specifying which program levels may do the activity during open program time such as evening programs.
- Saturday AM: Cub Scouts have a separate space working on Belt Loops.
- Saturday PM: Cub Scouts will be at the same stations as older Scouts, but with age appropriate
 programming at those stations.
- Sunday AM: Cub Scouts have a separate space working on STEM Activities.
- Sunday PM: Cub Scouts have a shooting sports area, and their own Amazing Race competition.
- Monday: The entire property switches to program designed for families and units to do together.

 - Co-ed unit.
 - Adult Leadership Provided. Limited to 4 Scouts per unit.

Notes: Participants are being considered a youth through age 20 for this event to match Senior Scouting and Order of the Arrow youth participant ages. They still need to follow YPT rules of 18. Provisional units are only available for units with less than four youth participants. If you have more youth than that wanting to attend from your unit, you must provide their adult leadership and register as a unit.

Step 1: Blackpug Registration for the Event

As you are gathering information from your unit on who wants to attend, here are some details to gather for registering everyone:

- Rank (needed for wristbands and class information)
- Email Address (youth or parent's)

- Note: Adult Leadership MUST show Health Form Parts A&B for everyone on property on arrival.

Weekend- Youth: \$25	Cubs through Senior Scouting Programs.	Weekend Participant camping/meals with unit. The will be a question for each youth on their rank. Day Only- Adults: \$10	Adults (21+)	Day Only Participant on Monday. NOT camping. Meals with unit or personal responsibility.
Day Only- Youth: \$10	Cubs through Senior Scouting Programs.	Day Only Participant on Monday. NOT camping. Meals with unit or personal responsibility. Must have Unit or Parental Supervision.
Staff: \$35		Staffing the majority of the weekend, and camping/ eating as staff.

Special Note: All Registrations up to March 15th come with a pair of solar eclipse glasses and an event patch. After that date, glasses/patch are not guaranteed.

Step 2: Google Form- Campsite Request

This form is only completed once per unit. It will ask which camp area you would like to camp in, and then ask for a campsite preference. There is a "no preference" option. The last question is for units that know they will have unregistered Cub Scout parents with them as we have to mark those campsites differently.

Teams will receive a check-in time in their weekend check-in envelope. Team members should arrive by then at Leadership Hall.

Every 20 minutes we will be getting 10 teams checked in and rules gone over, to then stagger their start times as the next group checks in. Please be on time and have all your team supplies.

Prizes will be awarded to the top teams.

Program Block: What day and time it is offered.

Wristband Color: To easily identify what age levels may participate in an activity station we designed the age levels in rainbow color order. If your age level comes earlier in the rainbow than the color listed, you may also participate in that activity. At the event itself, the station signs will list all colors who may participate on the bottom of the sign.


