WHO CAN ATTEND

Everyone is welcome! Cub Scouts, Scouts, Venturers, Explorers, Sea Scouts, adult volunteers, Scouting families, and the general public are invited to attend. Come with your unit or as a family.

Some activities will be limited to youth of certain ages. Children not yet enrolled in kindergarten are welcome to attend but will not be able to participate in any of the age-restricted activities. Parents are directly responsible for the care and supervision of their children. Guests not registered in a Scouting program are only permitted to visit Saturday, April 26, cannot camp overnight, and will submit a Non-Scout Guest Hold-Harmless agreement upon arrival.

Leadership and Youth Protection Guidelines: All participants must adhere to Scouting America's youth protection guidelines, including providing adequate adult supervision and appropriate camping accommodations. REGISTRATION

Cost: \$30 per youth / \$15 per adult

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WHAT TO BRING

ESSENTIAL PACKING LIST

Campers should pack wisely and lightly. Check the weather before you pack, and try to limit electronics, as most campsites lack electricity and there will be no charging stations available.

BRING

- For overnight campers: tent, sleeping bag, camping gear, change of clothes, toiletries
- Meals, cooking gear, plates, and utensils
- Closed-toed, closed-heel walking shoes
- Re-usable water bottle
- Flashlights or headlamps with extra batteries
- Sunscreen
- Rain gear (Activities will be rain or shine!)
- Non-aerosol insect repellent
- Any necessary medications
- Scouting America members must bring Annual Health and Medical Record (parts A and B)

DO NOT BRING

- · Alcohol or drugs
- Fireworks
- Bikes, skateboards, ATVs
- Firearms
- Pets

PARTICIPANT MEALS

Please note that food is not included in the event cost. Food may be available for purchase at some locations, but guests are responsible for their own meals. Scouts are encouraged to plan and prepare meals together with their unit (e.g. troop).

SAMPLE MEAL PLAN FOR SCOUT GROUPS

- Friday Dinner: plan to eat off-site before arriving, bring sandwiches or pizza, simple camp meal, cracker barrel, snacks
- Saturday Breakfast: yogurt, fruit, bagels, pastries, premade breakfast sandwiches or breakfast burritos, something simple you only have to heat up (consider distributing lunch at breakfast so that Scouts don't have to come back to the campsite)
- Saturday Lunch: grab-and-go, pre-packaged lunch sacks with sandwiches, chips, fruit and a drink
- Saturday Dinner: simple campout meal, already prepared camp meals to be re-heated, freeze dried camp meals, walking tacos, burgers/hot dogs, prepare as much as possible before
- Snacks: make sure to have snacks readily available for all participants

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IMPORTANT INFO ·

JOIN THE STAFF

We're on the lookout for fantastic leaders to help run Adventure Summit 25! Event staff will pay a \$25 fee to cover meals and will receive exclusive staff swag at no extra cost. Each campground lead will select their team, so reach out to them directly or fill out the interest form at <u>https://stlbsa.org/as25</u>, and we'll notify them of your interest! Staff are encouraged to be 18+ years old. If they're younger, they need to participate and enjoy the experience!

HEALTH AND SAFETY

- All youth and adults registered in Scouting programs must bring their Annual Health and Medical Record (Parts A & B) but keep it with leaders, parents, or themselves—event staff won't collect forms. Inform staff of any health concerns at check-in.
- Unit leaders and families should handle basic first aid, as they would on any campout. First aid stations will be available for additional needs.
- Non-Scout guests don't need a health form but must participate only in suitable activities and submit a Non-Scout Guest Hold-Harmless Agreement upon arrival.
- Additional parental consent forms or waivers may be required for certain activities.
