Getting Ready for Fall Cub Scout Recruitment

Fall recruitment season will be here before you know it — and the packs that plan ahead are the ones that grow. Here are a few things every pack should be doing right now:

Start mapping your calendar:

School Calendars: Note when parent-teacher nights and school events are scheduled — these are prime opportunities to get in front of families. Begin thinking about the best window for your pack's Sign-Up Night, keeping in mind that dates should stay *tentative* for now. In schools where our District Executives can arrange a lunchroom rally, those events are consistently the most effective recruitment tool we have, and scheduling may shift to make room for them.

No lunchroom access? Start building now. If your school hasn't opened the door to lunchroom rallies, don't wait — use the summer to build brand awareness in your community and keep your unit active and visible. A pack that stays engaged over the summer is a pack families want to join in the fall.

Reminder: Lion & Tiger Adult Partners Must Register Separately

Signing your child's Lion or Tiger application as parent partner does not automatically make you a registered adult volunteer. Unit Leaders should advise adult partners wishing to hold a leadership role that they must submit a separate Scouting America adult application. Contact your pack's Key 3 or reach out to the district for assistance getting registered!

The Council office has moved to using Scoutbook to log Advancement. This will help ensure advancement is recorded correctly and timely. *PLEASE BE SURE TO RECORD ADVANCEMENT FOR YOUR YOUTH AS IT OCCURS.*

- Regularly input advancement into Scoutbook
- Have the Unit Leader "approve" that advancement within Scoutbook
- Have the Unit Leader "award" that advancement within Scoutbook

Approving and awarding can be easily done within Scoutbook by regularly running a "Needs Approval" or "Needs Awarding" report where you can quickly approve it all. We'd really appreciate your Units staying up to date with this!

Logging "Service Hours":

When your youth and adults do community service, please be sure to log those hours using Scoutbook so that they may be rolled into the Council total – all service hours are totaled for the Council and then at the national level and are reported to Congress during the Scouting America's Report to The Nation every spring. Each hour of Volunteer Time is currently valued at over \$31 Per Hour!

Conservation Good Turn Award:

Another of the awards our Scouts (all programs) and Scouters (yes, scouters) can earn is the Conservation Good Turn Award which is described here: <https://www.scouting.org/outdoor-programs/conservation-and-environment/conservation-good-turn/>

SCOUTS BSA REQUIREMENTS UPDATES:

Ranks:

There are updates to the Scouts BSA Advancement program that became effective on January 1st, 2024. There are minor changes to the Scout and Star ranks (#6). Note that the Cyberchip has been phased out and Scouts should use the Personal Safety Awareness training at:

Palms:

Scouts BSA no longer have to wait 3 months between Eagle Palms – they have to earn 5 additional merit badges and live by the Scout Oath and Law.

Citizenship in Society discontinued:

Citizenship in Society has been discontinued effective February 27, 2026. Scouts who started this merit badge prior to that date may continue to work on it until December 31, 2026, though it is no longer an Eagle Required merit badge – see below for more information on Eagle Scout requirements.

Scouting America has implemented something new – The *Scouts BSA Test Lab* is an exciting way to help in the development of fun and interesting new topics unique to the Scouts BSA program. The requirements for each badge have the look and feel of merit badges, but instead of a printed pamphlet, you will find links to digital resources to help you complete the requirements. If enough surveys show Scouts enjoyed these potential new badges and a badge becomes an official merit badge, Scouts will be credited with having earned that badge! For more information, visit

EAGLE SCOUTS

Important - Eagle Scout Rank Requirements Change/Eagle Scout Application Change:

Effective February 27, 2026, the “Citizenship in Society” was been discontinued, though Scouts who began this merit badge *before* that date may continue to complete it before December 31, 2026. There are now 13 Eagle Required merit badges with a total of 21 merit badges needed to earn the rank of Eagle Scout. The Eagle Scout Application has been changed to reflect this (see below for the link). An additional line for parents’ contact

information has also been added in the “Letters of Recommendation” section. Here is an article that clarifies the Eagle Scout Application changes:

Eagle Scout Letters of Recommendation: Reference letter requirements for Eagle Scouts have been updated. See Section 9.0.1.3 of the updated Guide to Advancement:

References: Must list names and contact information for four people who are willing to serve as references for the Eagle candidate. These may be Scout leaders, teachers, employers, coaches, other Scouts, etc. References do not need to be 21 or older. **Parents and other relatives are strongly discouraged** from serving as references. **The current unit leader and committee chair are not eligible to serve as references; their signature on the application is their endorsement.**

Youth protection is at the heart of everything we do. Announced at the Scouting America National Annual Meeting in Orlando, the new Safeguarding Youth training is now live and mandatory for all registered adult volunteers. It is also a joining requirement for new adult members.

Requirements: Complete all lessons + score 80% or higher on the final test

Annual Refresher:

After completing the full course once, a 15-minute refresher and retest is required each year to stay current. The refresher is now available followed by a test (you must score 80% or higher or you will need to re-take the 90-minute course).

Transition from Previous YPT:

If you've already completed Youth Protection Training (YPT), your certification remains valid until May 2026. However - there is new material in the SYT which could genuinely save the life of a youth - inside or outside of Scouting.

Why This Matters:

Youth protection is at the heart of everything we do. This updated training reinforces a culture of active supervision, situational awareness, and safety, ensuring we're all equipped to help keep our Scouts safe.

Hazardous Weather Training:
