Locations: Thomas F. Eagleton U.S. Courthouse
AND The Gateway Arch

Times: Arrive at the Eagleton Courthouse at 8:30 a.m. for check-in. Program begins at 9:00 a.m. The group will walk to the Gateway Arch at 2:30 p.m., and be dismissed from there at 4:30 pm.



Learn what it means to be a citizen of the United States by participating in a variety of sessions, touring a federal facility, and touring a site that is on the National Register of Historic Places. The program begins at the Thomas F. Eagleton U.S. Courthouse and ends at the Gateway Arch. Presenters will be from both facilities, and will include a federal judge. The workshop is free, but reservations are required, and space is limited.

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY AS REGISTRATION HAS CHANGED FROM PREVIOUS YEARS:

- **Minimum age requirement:** Scouts MUST have reached 13th birthday by July 6.
- Registrations will be taken on a first come, first served basis, **beginning at 7:00 A.M. on Monday, April 17.**
- Once the program is full, additional names will be added to a waiting list.
- Registrations will only be taken through the online form. Phone registrations will not be taken.
- You may register multiple Scouts, but you MUST complete a new form for each Scout. Spots will not be held for any Scouts with missing information.
- Collect the following information for EACH Scout before attempting to complete the form(s). Scouts will not be considered registered if information is missing.
 - Parent Name
 - Parent Email Address
 - Parent Phone Number
 - Scout Name
 - Troop # and District
 - Age Scout will be on July 6
 - Allergies/special needs/other health concerns
 - Name of parent attending (optional)
 - Name and cell # of an emergency contact who is NOT attending the program
