The Council office has moved to accept only Scoutbook or Internet Advancement Forms. This will help ensure records are recorded correctly and timely. *PLEASE BE SURE TO RECORD ADVANCEMENT FOR YOUR YOUTH AS IT OCCURS:*

An electronic or paper copy of the Advancement Report from Scoutbook or Internet Advancement must be presented to the Scout Shops when purchasing Rank Awards and Merit Badges as these are restricted items. The Advancement Report should have the wording "SCOUTBOOK Advancement Sync with BSA National Database" at the end if it is a paper copy.

Logging "Service Hours":

When your youth and adults do community service, please be sure to log those hours using Scoutbook so that they may be rolled into the Council total – all service hours are totaled for the Council and then at the national level and are reported to Congress during the Boy Scouts of America's Report To The Nation every spring. Each hour of Volunteer Time is currently valued at \$31.80 Per Hour!

Conservation Good Turn Award:

Another of the awards our Scouts (all programs) and Scouters (yes, scouters) can earn is the Conservation Good Turn Award which is described here: <https://www.scouting.org/outdoor-programs/conservation-and-environment/conservation-good-turn/>

SCOUTS BSA REQUIREMENTS UPDATES:

There are updates to the Scouts BSA Advancement program that become effective on January 1st, 2024. There are minor changes to the Scout and Star ranks (#6). Note that the Cyberchip has been phased out and Scouts should use the Personal Safety Awareness training at:

Scouts BSA will no longer have to wait 3 months between Eagle Palms – they will have to earn 5 additional merit badges and live by the Scout Oath and Law.

MERIT BADGES:

MERIT BADGE COUNSELORS:

Did you know that slightly more than 60% of all Merit Badge Counselors are trained???

Each merit badge counselor is **required** to complete the following online training (in addition to Youth Protection Training) – the online training takes less than an hour:

- SCO_471 Advancement
- SCO_472 Aims and Methods of Scouting
- SCO_474 Introduction to Merit Badges
- SCO_486 What is a Merit Badge Counselor

Merit Badge Counselor Renewals:

Starting this year, the Council will no longer be managing Merit Badge Counselor renewals at the Council level. The January invitation to renew will not be sent as in the past.

As of March 2024, National began assuming the renewal functions for membership status. National will send MB Counselors an email about 60 days before the merit badge counselor position expires asking Counselors to renew their merit badge counselor position. For the majority of our merit badge counselors that will be around early May aligning with the merit badge counselor position expiration date.

Already effective, anyone becoming a merit badge counselor who is not registered in a unit or district must pay the \$25 annual fee. If you are not a member of a unit or a district Member at Large you will need to pay your annual fee at the time of renewal.

Please keep your email address up to date on your BSA membership account as National does not sync with our directory. National will use the email address you have attached to your membership account.

2024 Annual Membership Fee Update:

Effective April 1st, 2024 the BSA ***eliminated the \$25 one-time joining fee*** for new program participants in Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing, and Sea Scouting! The membership fee structure is as follows:

- **\$85/yr.** for Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouting participants (**\$5 increase**)
- **\$65/yr.** for all adult volunteers (**\$5 increase**)
- **\$30/yr.** for Scoutreach (**No change in fee**)
- **\$25/yr.** for Merit Badge Counselors (**No change in fee** – applies only to MB Counselors not already registered as leaders)
- **\$50/yr.** for Exploring participants Youth & Adults (**No change in fee**)
- **\$100/yr.** unit renewal/affiliation fee (**No change in fee**)

- **\$15/yr.** for Scout Life magazine (**No change in fee**)
- Excludes Council Program Fees
