Introduction to Outdoor Leadership Skills (IOLS)

A new Scoutmaster or Assistant Scoutmaster is considered trained upon completion of Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmaster Position-Specific Training **and** Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS).

This hands-on program gives adult leaders a practical introduction to the patrol method of a Scout-led troop by teaching many of the practical outdoor skills they need to lead Scouts in the out-of-doors. The IOLS course builds and expands on the concepts and themes introduced in Scoutmaster Position-Specific Training and provides Scouters with the confidence to take youth into the outdoors.

The course is designed for Scouts BSA leaders who have been involved in Scouting for at least (2) years and who have both observed and practiced the Patrol Method. Participants in the course will be tested on a slate of skills needed to successfully take your youth into the outdoors. Each participant will have two chances to pass each skill center, with no remedial training available. The intent of this course is to allow the participant to bypass the weekend long IOLS course, so it is imperative that the participant demonstrate proficiency in all of the following areas.

Prerequisites: Participants in the IOLS Challenge Course must be currently registered members of a Scouting unit, taken Scoutmaster Training either online or classroom session and must hold current certifications in Youth Protection and Hazardous Weather training.



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Cub Scout Adult Leader Training

Cub Scout Adult Leader Training is for Cubmasters, Assistant Cubmasters, Committee Chairs, Den Leaders, Pack Committee Members, and any adult in a Pack that wants to be trained. **The course is Saturday, March 8, 2025 8am to 11:30am.** The faculty provide comprehensive training enabling participants to better serve Cub Scouts. Unlike online learning, participants will benefit from the ability to actively participate, ask questions and learn from each other. Participants will leave the classroom ready to give their youth (and the youth around them) the best Cub Scouting experience.

Registration will start at 7:30 am with the training to start at 8:00 am. The program will end before noon on Sunday. This fee includes 3 meal and materials. The registration fee is \$40.00 and \$45.00 for walk-ins.

Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO) is a training course for Cub Scout leaders and parents who want to participate in outdoor events with their den or pack. The training is required for at least one adult to attend any Cub Scout overnight event, including pack camping and Webelos den overnights. BALOO is typically offered in the fall and spring and consists of two parts: an online prerequisite and an in-person, hands-on component:

In-person component: This component includes an overnight camping experience and covers topics such as:

- Outdoor activities, games, and ceremonies
- Selecting and using camping equipment
- Running a campfire program
- Cub Scout cooking demonstrations
- Knife safety
- Knots
- First aid
- Aquatics
